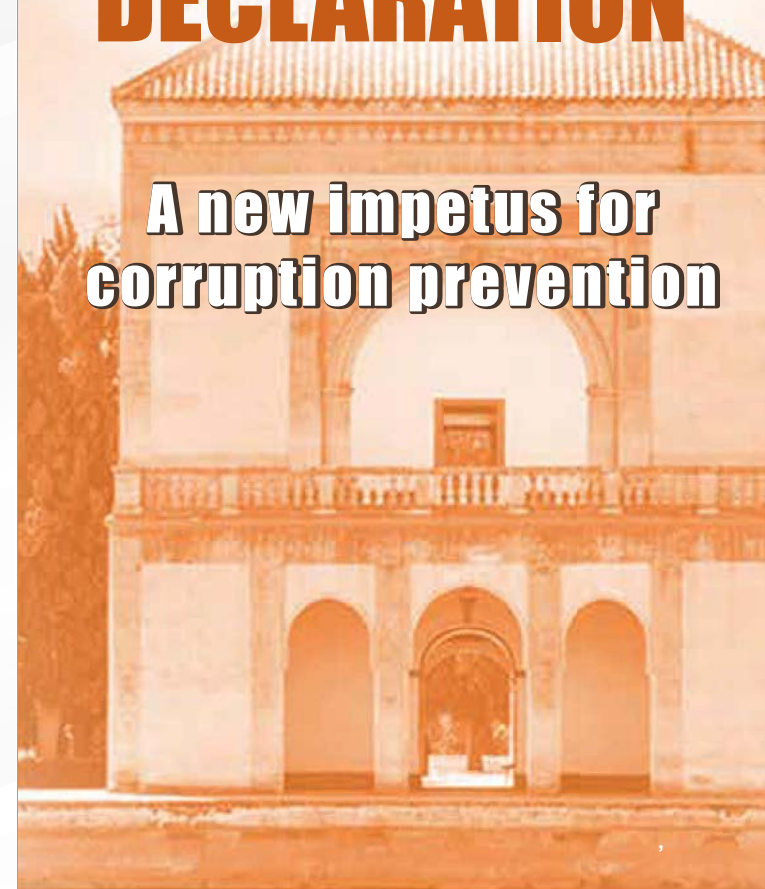

Context

The Marrakech Declaration on Corruption Prevention is a resolution adopted by the fourth session of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC) on October 28 2011, in Marrakech, Morocco. It reaffirms the essential role of prevention measures to face the impacts of corruption. The Declaration calls on States Parties to UNCAC to implement effective corruption prevention measures, particularly in the following areas:

- the rule of law and democratic governance;
- the culture of Integrity and ethics;
- Investment and the private sector;
- Civil society participation.

Twelve years after its adoption, the principles enshrined in the Marrakech Declaration remain as relevant as ever and demand revitalization to further bolster the States Parties' efforts in the domain of prevention.



Objectives of the event

Since The fight against corruption requires a constant search for new and innovative approaches, the main objectives of this event are to:

- Underlining the importance of prevention as one of the main pillars in the fight against corruption;
